Rector's Reflections

Are you doing anything on 13th September?

I wonder if you have heard of a charity called the
Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust?



The charity exists to give grants to churches of all denominations towards the costs of repair and maintenance, and will also support plans to improve and upgrade church facilities. Every year, they promote an event called "Ride and Stride", which encourages people to be sponsored to visit as many churches as possible. Funds raised are split equally between a designated church and the charity as a whole. This year, Ride and Stride takes place on Saturday 13th September.

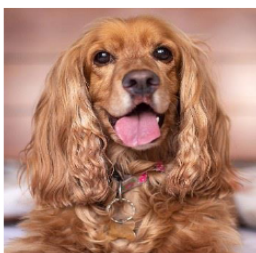
Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust is an excellent charity, and many churches in our area have successfully applied for grants from the trust. (I should add that I serve as the local Area Representative, so do be in touch if you have any further questions!)

Why is the work of the trust so important? In short, it is because it is getting harder and harder for churches to find the money and volunteers to look after their buildings and to adapt them appropriately for the 21st Century. Looking at England, Wales and Scotland as a whole, it is widely recognised that the situation has reached a crisis point. Christian denominations are no longer able to look after their historic buildings. They simply don't have the money or the people to do so.

Some denominations, such as the Church of Scotland, are undertaking a radical programme of church closure. However, the Church of England has avoided taking such a radical step, and is trying its best to muddle through. Individual churches are encouraged to keep on top of regular maintenance, in the hope that regular maintenance will forestall major problems with the building. Churches are also encouraged to open themselves to wider use by community groups. Some grants are also available, and charities such as Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust play a significant role. Many churches also benefit from "Friends" schemes.

But at the end of the day, it would be fair to say that as a whole, the Church of England is finding it harder and harder to care for the historic church buildings for which it is responsible. It simply does not have the money or the volunteers needed to take care of the thousands of buildings under its care. Something needs to be done. But what? All thoughts gratefully received!

In the meantime, if you value our historic churches, I would encourage you to support the work of charities such as the Oxford Historic Churches Trust. Perhaps you might be tempted to take part in the Ride and Stride on Saturday 13th September? It's great fun, and you will be playing your part in helping us to preserve our precious church buildings, not only for own generation but also for generations to come. Father Jason.

In the Church of England, it runs from **September 1st to October 4th**, culminating on St Francis' Day. Churches use this time to reflect on humanity's responsibility for the Earth and all its inhabitants. The Church of England celebrates Creationtide and during this time we...

- **Focus on God as Creator:** It's a time to acknowledge and give thanks for God's creation and to reflect on the relationship between God, humanity, and the natural world.
- **Focus on our environmental responsibility:** It's an opportunity to consider the impact of human actions on the environment and to renew commitments to caring for the planet. Many churches incorporate Creationtide into their Harvest celebrations, giving thanks for the food and resources provided by God's creation.

Focus on a deepening connection with our faith: It encourages churches and individuals to connect their faith with environmental concerns, prompting reflection and action.

Recovery from Summer

It's been another very hot, and dry summer. Our gardens are showing signs of this stress, dying trees and shrubs for many, with the drought and resulting hosepipe ban taking their toll. A lot of oak trees in our local landscape are also looking stressed, leaves turned brown early.

If you cut your garden lawn, it's probably the colour of your patio right now, but it should come back to life with enough rain. If you left your lawn long or even grew a mini-meadow then you might still be looking at long green grass as well as beautiful flowers and seed heads. All of this will look equally beautiful in the first frosts, when they come.

It's been a tough year for many crops again in the fields, with predicted shortages of some UK vegetables this autumn. But fruit has done well. That's good news for wildlife enjoying the early blackberries and elderberries. However, it will mean a shortage of food through autumn and winter, especially for birds as the fruit will be gone. Heat and prolonged drought also affect insect numbers, as their habitat and larvae are lost. This means lower numbers of insects next year too (less caterpillars for baby birds in spring, less moths for bats, etc).

So, here are some things you can do in your garden to help nature out -

Store any fallen fruit from your garden now to put it out on colder days over the next few months.

Leave part of your garden in a softer style, with some longer grass, less clipped shrubs and hedges, so any last berries stay on the plant for longer.

Instead of promptly 'putting your garden to bed,' let your flower beds and borders more naturally and slowly change with the season. This gives home to many beneficial insects over winter.

Save your cutting back until spring when the last frosts have gone and /or work around the garden in sections (this means overwintering insects (in all stages of life) have more chance of survival until next year).

Leave ivy to flower into the autumn to help pollinators.

Make a plan for next year's garden – do you have room for a mini-pond? A wilder corner? A mini meadow? New, native hedging or shrubs somewhere?

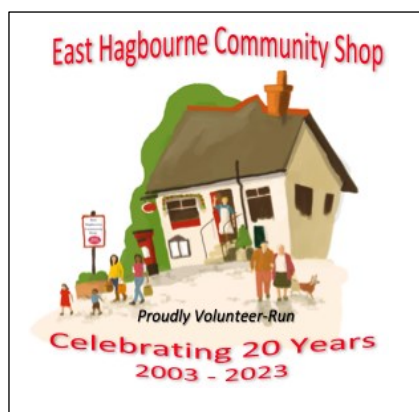

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

New housing opposite the school It was good to see the children's playground opening around the end of the school term. It is already being well used by residents of the estate and other Hagbourners. The Parish Council is maintaining its links with Deanfield who have a few items to complete before the handover of responsibilities to Eaves Management and the forthcoming residents committee. The main issues concern planting of some trees, the re-planting of some of the boundary hedge with the car park, and a re-seeding of the wildflower area which are planned in the autumn planting season. Let us hope that the weather will be more obliging this time around.

CIL Projects Although the last month has been the main holiday month, there was a surprising amount of activity that will result in a busy parish council meeting on 11th September. Depending on some of the decisions taken at the meeting, I hope that we will be able to provide significant benefits to the village and villagers.

Much of this activity concerned planning for CIL projects so that work on these can take place before the winter arrives. One plan is that before the onset of prolonged bad weather (should we ever see real rain again) the extension of footpath 12 from Parsonage Lane (aka the Causeway) to Church Lane will be complete so that even in the depth of winter there will be good access from Fieldside to the church and school that avoids Main Road. In addition, a smooth connection is proposed from footpath 12 to the Causeway (two streams path FP 13). This will enable mobility vehicles and wheelchairs to come from Fieldside to Main Road via the Causeway.

The community room in the Pavilion will benefit from much improved lighting and lighting controls (already done) and better acoustics (scheduled for October). The lighting on the path from Great Mead to the Pavilion will be improved and also extended to the car park to address problems people had last year when getting from their cars to and from the Pavilion.

On our other car park by the Village Hall, we plan to greatly improve the configuration for the disabled parking bays and we believe that a third party may organize and cover the installation of facilities for bicycle parking. The signage that we lost when the car park extension was being built will be renewed using our now iconic design.

The wildflower meadow in the Cemetery will have a new bench and there will be improved signage for the Cemetery. Road safety will be improved by the installation of vehicle activated signs that will hopefully result in slower and legal traffic speeds through the village. As part of this activity, we will also obtain accurate data on traffic speeds at key points that will support or refute the man claims of speeding in the village. I should add that it is notoriously difficult to estimate car speeds when they zoom past you, perhaps even when they are going within our new speed limit.

Other major works Among other major works that we can anticipate over the next year or so, we are progressing with plans for a significant improvement to the car park at the Pavilion that will hopefully be more sustainable.

Much work has already been done to understand the problem of flooding in the Cemetery, and it is hoped that some significant remediation will be in place before the next storms.

Artists are in place for the three Art Projects, the S106 funding for this is now being applied for, with agreements for the owners of land hosting the projects being obtained. In the case of the bus shelter, quotes are being sought for work to repair the shelter prior to the installation of art works.

The reckoning I hope the above will get you excited about how the village and village life might be getting better in an age when much is happening in the world to counter such expectations and aspirations. So let us hope that the developments above do come to fruition in the near future, and we will not be embarrassed by perceived broken promises. So watch the update in forthcoming magazines.

Parish Council meetings The next meeting of East Hagbourne Parish Council will be held in the Pavilion in the Recreation Ground starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 11th September. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting.

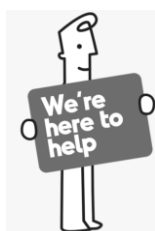

FRIENDS OF HAGBOURNE POOL

Our lovely pool has been an integral part of Hagbourne CE Primary School since the 1970s, helping children develop water safety skills, build confidence, and stay active.

We're sure many readers of the Parish Magazine will have fond memories of the pool. Perhaps you were part of the original working party who helped dig the ground all those years ago? Or maybe you, your children, or your grandchildren were taught to swim there.

Currently, all Hagbourne pupils are fortunate to swim for two terms each year, from Reception through to Year 6.

The pool is also used by children from other local schools, including Blewbury and Chilton, and benefits the wider community through after-school and weekend swim sessions, baby and toddler classes, lifesaving training, local groups like Cubs and Young Farmers, and free lessons for eligible children through the YouMove initiative.

Friends of Hagbourne Pool is a newly registered charity (No. 1213633) set up to support and enhance the swimming provision at Hagbourne School.

We're currently fundraising for:

- Replacement of the pool liner, skimmers, and pool surround.
- Upgrading the outdated heating and filtration systems to improve efficiency and sustainability.

The total cost is estimated at £34,000. Thanks to existing funds, grants, and generous pledges, we're already over halfway there. Pupils have raised over £4,000 through two themed fundraising challenges: HMS Hagbourne (a pirate adventure) last Summer, and this year's Swimming Pool Time Machine challenge, celebrating the 150 year anniversary of the school. We hope their involvement gives the children a lasting sense of pride and achievement.

Our goal is to complete the essential refurbishment this winter, during the pool's closure period.

Restoring the pool will ensure it remains a vibrant, inclusive space for learning, fun, and community use for years to come. With school swimming provision under pressure nationally, keeping Hagbourne's pool open helps protect access for all—regardless of background.

Bus service to the Churchill, Nuffield and Warneford Hospitals

The bus to catch for any of these hospitals from the centre of Oxford is number 15 which is every 1/4 hour during the day, taking 10-12 minutes, longer at busy times.

You can catch it near the entrance to the Covered Market or near Queen's Lane. Those stops work whether you're connecting from Didcot with the Thames Travel X32 or, quicker but more walking, using the train from Didcot. The set down points are announced on the bus; for the Warneford, Warneford Road; for the Churchill, Roosevelt Drive; for the Nuffield, the stop is further on, called Lime Walk, and is actually in Old Road near the Old Road entrance to the hospital.

The website for the 15 is <https://www.oxfordbus.co.uk/services/OXBC/15>, where you can also find a useful bus map and even live information. When using the X32 to Oxford, it's also possible to connect with the 15 near the Police Station, generally fewer people trying to get on at once.
